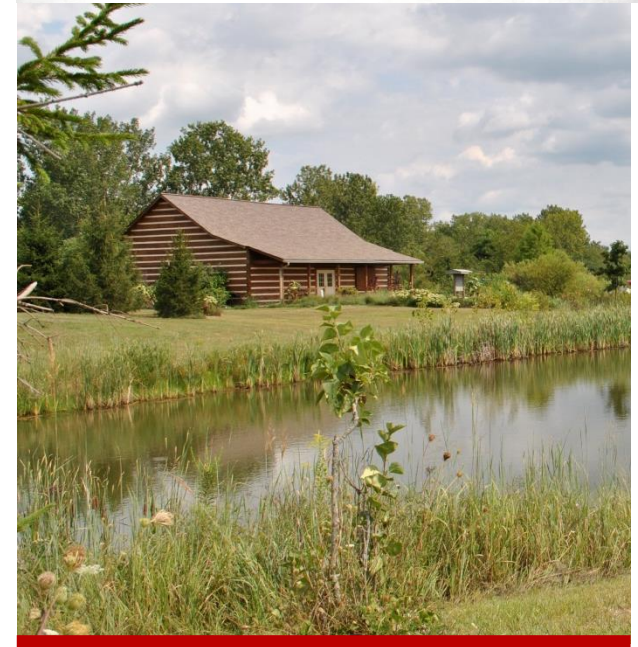

Getting to the Gwynne:

The Gwynne Conservation Area and Gwynne Cabin are located just north of the FSR Exhibit Area on Arbuckle Road. Shuttle wagons run to the Gwynne on a continuous basis each day from 9:00 am until 3:30 pm. **Catch a shuttle at the west end of the FSR exhibit area in front of the Fendrick Headquarters Building.** Expect to wait about 10 minutes to take the quick shuttle ride to the Gwynne. **It's worth it!**
